

**New Sharon City Council Meeting**  
**Wednesday, November 18, 2009**  
**7:00 p.m., City Hall**

The New Sharon City Council met in regular session at City Hall, Wednesday, November 18, 2009 @ 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Edwin Davis presiding. Council members present were Kenneth Ward, Dianna Klinker, Larry Applegate and Zack Pickard. Lisa Munn was absent. Others in attendance were Brad Korell & Melissa Korell. Employees in attendance were Kevin Lamberson and Diane Brand.

Klinker made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Applegate made a motion to approve a building permit for Brad & Melissa Korell and set a date for the public hearing for December 7 at 7pm. Ward seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Pickard made a motion to allow Korell's to start digging their basement right away. Ward seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

There was some discussion regarding possibly running a sewer line down W. Cherry Street. Mayor Davis will contact Gene Fox regarding this project.

Mayor Davis gave the water report. After fixing a water leak on S. Columbia Street, the water usage has gone down to less than 100,000 gallons per day. Gritter's Electric were called to repair the pumps at the river pump house.

Lamberson gave the Police Report.

Applegate gave the Cemetery Report. Hoven's sprayed the cemetery and recommended waiting to treat the grubs.

Brand gave the Clerk's Report. Stephen Memorial Animal Shelter picked up four cats and two dogs in the month of October. Brand asked if the council would extend the contract with Aaron Schock for snow removal and Pickard made a motion to extend it for another year. Klinker seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

Applegate made a motion to extend the expiration date on Josh Tremmel's building permit to April of 2011. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: All ayes.

There was discussion regarding a parking ordinance for semis, camping trailers, cargo trailers, boat trailers, etc. The ordinance will prevent semis and trailers of any kind to be parked on city streets. There will be a 30-minute loading and unloading provision. The amount of the parking ticket pertaining to semis and trailers will be increased

Brand, Davis and Chief Gerard met with a loss control specialist from EMC Insurance regarding the fire stations worker's comprehensive coverage. He recommends revising the stations requirements pertaining to physicals. The Public Safety Committee will meet with Gerard after the holidays to discuss this further.

At this time, Dianna Klinker turned in her resignation. Applegate made a motion to accept her resignation. Pickard seconded. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Pickard, Ward and Applegate. Abstentions: Klinker.

There being no further business to discuss, Davis adjourned the meeting at 8:21 pm.
